Diamonds Elite

Building on a good result in Sheffield the Diamonds came out determined to put their mark on the game. With both teams exchanging 11 shots on each other's net, it was the netminders who kept the game tight during the first period. The Diamonds looked lively and with 50 seconds to go in the period, Shannon Jones broke the deadlock with an unassisted goal.

The 2nd period started with the Diamonds looking the stronger of the teams, and an excellent stretch pass from Beth Scoon sent Jones on a breakaway and again she made no mistake, pulling a lovely move and scoring her second of the night. For once the Diamonds were staying out of the penalty box and allowing the Lightning to take the penalties. A couple of power plays in the 2nd couldn't be capitalised on and the period ended 2-0.

Guildford are a team who don't know when they are beaten, and once again they piled on the pressure in the 3rd period and with 12 minutes to go they halved the score. With time running out it looked like the Diamonds had done enough to hold on to both points, but once again the Lightning struck to equalise the game, this time with just 2 minutes remaining. This led to an edgy end to the game as both teams looked for a winner, and the game ended 4 on 4 after a couple of penalties, following some big body checks. Neither team could steal another goal in the dying moments and both teams took one point from the game. Probably a fair result but its always frustrating to lose a point after being in control for the first two periods. I'm sure the next meeting will be equally as tight.

The girls will have a couple of well-earned weeks off to enjoy Christmas and the New Year before they are back in action on the 21st January away at Bracknell.

After a quick line change the pressure on the Scotland net showed as Ketziah Robinson opened the scoring at 1:29, assisted by Caren Callaghan.
