The Queen Bees opened the scoring at 7.24 as Great Britain stalwart Leanne Ganney scored on her first game back after a long injury. Holly Steeples in net kept the Diamonds in the game as she saved 36 of 39 shots faced for a save percentage of 92.3%.
